In addition to presentations there are photographic opportunities. "Photo Ops" provides you with expertly orchestrated opportunities to capture people, animal and objects in a prearranged setting to achieve the optimal image. While these images are not allowed in our competition, it is never the less a good way to learn how to arrange your own setups. Then there are outstanding models to photograph. This activity is phenomenally organized. These images are



useable in WPS competition. Another activity is the supreme Print and Digital competitions. You may recall that WPS hosted a presentation of the 2013 NECCC Print competition winners. The images were impressive. Last year I was among those awarded ribbons. This could be your year to be a winner. Be sure to check the rules on the NECCC website, as they differ from WPS.

The extremely eloquent Sam Abell is this year's keynote speaker. All will be impressed by his all inspiring insights and lasting impression images. There will also be vendors selling their wares. Hunt's will give you an appraisal for used equipment for money or trade in towards new equipment. Nikon, Canon, Tamron and Sigma will have awe-some cameras and/or optimal lenses you can take out on loan and try around campus.

July will be here before you know it. Our one and only town crier Marty Bernstein has been announcing NECCC, for the past weeks, and will be collecting registrations so we can get a nice discount, if we reach the group number of 20 or more. Further, those who want to make lodging arrangements need to act post haste, as there is a lim-

ited number of motels. There are alternate lodging accommodations through UMass. Another excellent reason to attend is to be able to hang out with terrific WPS club members.

To recap the highlights: there will be great presentations on all aspects of photographic capture and processing, opportunities to take fabulous pictures of set ups and models, compete with outstanding members from other clubs, try out top notch equipment, buy new gear and have the most fun filled photographic weekend you can imagine. I highly recommend you check out the NECCC web site (http://www.neccc.org). Feel free to talk to me or other members who have attended before. Most importantly, make plans to go this year. Does it all sound like the very best thing you could do over a July weekend – well it is. And that ain't no hyperbole.

The Transit Museum, located in a former IND station in Brooklyn Heights, is a fascinating historic overview of the NYC subway system since its inception. The main floor has original parts of the trains, photographs of the times from horse drawn carriages to token booths and turnstiles. Downstairs are the fabulous old trains that bring New Yorkers back to their childhood or tourists to an understanding of how the incredible subway system developed. Amongst the most interesting things were the signs and posters inside the subway cars we used to read as we rode along: health tips, NYC historic facts, ads, theatrical ads, jokes, Miss Subway, and so much more that seem to be missing today.

After a delicious Mid-Eastern lunch, we ambled over to the Brooklyn Bridge for the afternoon light.
