Camera-less Photography?!?

NY Times puzzle, Saturday, December 24, 2019, 24 across: "Dadaist who experimented with camera-less photography." Answer "Man Ray." I got curious and started researching.

In order to come to terms with the trauma and disillusionment of WWI, the Dadaists experimented with new modes of creating art. In 1922, Man Ray began experimenting with placing objects, including people, onto photosensitive paper, then exposing it to light in order to create a negative. Although camera-less photography had been in existence since the 1830's, Man Ray's photograms, or as he eponymously renamed them "rayographs," reflected his abstractions and "irrational combinations and chance arrangements of objects." Subsequently, his creativity led him to apply these methods to moving images.

Even though Man Ray was/is often associated with both Dadaism and Surrealism, he never felt he was either...he was Man Ray.

It is suggested that his unfettered imagination has, in part, led the photography world to digital manipulations.

There is no room here to expand further. However, Man Ray's insatiable creativity should be an inspiration to us all. Without limiting our imaginations, we can, each of us, create fascinating works of art...and then allow ourselves to take each to the next step, the next steps.

That's one suggestion for a New Year's resolution!



Ira Block on January 10

Ira Block is an internationally renowned photographer, teacher and lecturer who has produced over 30 stories for the National Geographic Magazine. He has led National Geographic Photo Workshops, Expeditions and private workshops to Mongolia, Bhutan, Cuba and Tibet

where students learn about culture and photographic vision. His documentary photography work is balanced by a stable of commercial clients for whom he shoots portraits and corporate branding. Ira can best be described as a cultural documentary photographer. He uses his cameras and lights to document people around the world, recording the change in traditions and practices. He has had photographic exhibitions around the world. As a Sony Artisan of Imagery, Ira is often called upon to comment and give critical feedback on the Sony products he uses to create his work.



Charles Needle on January 17

Charles Needle is a highly acclaimed fine art and editorial nature photographer with a unique eye for design and artistic interpretation. His images evoke a spiritual, almost meditative, quality which draws viewers into the essence of each form. Charles is deeply

aware of the inherent order in all of nature, and he aims to capture this order by portraying each subject's inner beauty from even the smallest of details.

Today, Charles' award-winning fine art nature photographs are on permanent display in numerous hospitals, homes and offices nationwide. In addition, he has produced a videotape featuring his photography, called The Healing Power of Nature, which plays currently in more than 40 hospital and physicians' waiting rooms across the country and on closed-circuit television in numerous hospitals, including Emory University Hospital in Atlanta and The National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, MD.



Stephen Wilkes on January 31

Since opening his studio in New York City in 1983, photographer Stephen Wilkes has built an unprecedented body of work and a reputation as one of America's most iconic photographers, widely recognized for his fine art, editorial and commercial work.

Day to Night, Wilkes' most defining project, began in 2009. These epic cityscapes and landscapes, portrayed from a fixed camera angle for up to 30 hours capture fleeting moments of humanity as light passes in front of his lens over the course of full day. Blending these images into a single photograph takes months to complete. Day to Night has been featured on CBS Sunday Morning as well as dozens of other prominent media outlets and, with a grant from the National Geographic Society, was recently extended to include America's National Parks in celebration of their centennial anniversary and Bird Migration for the 2018 Year of the Bird. Day to Night : In the Field with Stephen Wilkes was exhibited at the The National Geographic Museum in February, 2018.


