Joel Pollack on January 12

Midjourney AI and Generative Fill

I have written a talk that was written specifically to address the interests of our camera club and likely yours. I am well versed in the methods and protocols of Midjourney. In my talk we will introduce Midjourney AI, show sample images, go over how to install Midjourney and Discord, demonstrate writing Midjourney prompts, illustrate Midjourney/Photoshop workshop, discuss if not for photography competition where else could AI imaging be used.

Rio

Joel is an industry expert in electronic displays, holding a BS in Physics from Rochester Institute of Technology and an MS in Materials Science from the University of Rochester. He has worked as a physicist at Xerox WRC, engineering and marketing manager at Tektronix, VP of the Display Business Unit at Sharp Microelectronics of the Americas, the CEO of the venture funded startup, Clairvoyante, developing PenTile, a display technology that is now used in all of Samsung's Galaxy phones as well as all the recent iPhones. He was director of displays for Nvidia. In 2016 he retired from Amazon's Lab 126 where he managed display engineering for Amazon's digital products, such as Kindle e-readers, Echo Show and Kindle Fire tablets. Currently he is a private industry consultant for the development of a microLED light engine for use in augmented reality (AR). Joel is also a commercial drone pilot and an avid amateur photographer/videographer active in the Villages Camera Club of San Jose, one of the NCCCC camera clubs of Northern California. More recently he has applied himself to mastering Al imaging using Midjourney, the industry lead tool for promptography which he will cover in his presentation to us.

A Photojournalist's View of the Natural World

Carl D. Walsh has been a working photojournalist since 1984. He has collaborated with a range of national and regional publications, working on stories addressing a broad subject matter. Assignments about the natural world are closest to Carl's heart and capturing the beauty of birds and other wildlife was one of his earliest photographic inspirations, something he passionately pursues to this day. The appearance of a lost Asian Steller's Sea-Eagle in the New England prompted one of his raptor chases. Carl's image of this giant eagle was lead art for the National Audubon's story about the Steller's cross-continent saga. Another of his bird images was recognized in the Audubon Photography Awards. In addition to birds, Carl has photographed a variety of animal species and will include some images from his bear, mountain gorilla and whale stories.

TIPS

How to find your mouse cursor

When watching a demo, it can be difficult to see the presenter's cursor on the screen. This is how you can make it more visible. I have been using this for years on different versions of Windows. It also comes in handy when you are using multiple monitors and are not sure where your cursor is.

Open the search box on your task bar, search for Mouse, and select it from the list.

Dan Zafra has the "Capture the Atlas" site and offers education and workshops to photograph the MW and Aurora and even swim with orcas (you read that right). Take that as you wish, but I think this free "calendar" is useful to understand what I called "the phases" of the MW.

There seemed to be some interest in seeing the aurora. I mentioned Adrien Mauduit because he produces a lot of (very good) video, time lapse and real time of the aurora and other northern subjects. He is in Norway. I met him briefly and I support him on Buy Me a Coffee. But I think he's oriented more towards professionals who want to learn how to chase the aurora.

When I was in Yellowknife (Northwest Territories) in December 2018, I went with Sean Norman and again I went with him again last September in Whitehorse (Yukon), where he relocated. He takes at most three people. He's a great photographer (see his blog for examples). He also does day tours. His site is:
