

New Website!

By now you will have heard that our newly redesigned website is online. Thanks to Ron Carran for all the hard work in designing and implementing the new website and moving over all the content from the old website. We hope you enjoy the clean and modern look.

We have moved all the users over from the old website, however, we don't have access to your account password, so you will need to reactivate your account on the new website. Click on "Login" near the top of the page. Simply enter the email address associated with your account, and rather than entering your old password (which won't work), click on the "Forgot password?" link. You will then receive an email from the website (the email will come from Ron Carran ron@wpsphoto.org. In the email will be a "Reset Password" link. Click on that, enter your new password and you're in. Now you can see the members-only content.

How to Tell Compelling Stories Usina Pictures

There is tremendous joy in sharing our adventures through the medium of photography. This talk is focused on analyzing and understanding what is required to go beyond the postcard and create compelling visual stories. Selecting locations, what to look for in the field, techniques to create unique images, and how to render a personal interpretation of the landscape before you can communicate effectively with your audience.

Bio

Sapna Reddy is a nature/landscape photographer based in Northern California. She is currently pursuing dual careers as a doctor and a photographer. As a radiologist, she analyzes images in an attempt to establish diagnosis and achieve a cure. As a photographer she creates images that celebrate the immense beauty of nature and enhance personal wellbeing by establishing a strong and lasting connection with the great outdoors.

Her images have been published in several magazines/websites, including National Geographic, Onlandscape, Popular Photography, Lonely Planet, Landscape Photography Magazine, Better Photography, Smart Photography, and Outdoor Photographer.






To update your profile, after you log in, you will see your username near the top of the website, instead of the "Login" button. Next to it is a drop down menu. Click on that and select "Profile":




You can add a profile photo by clicking on the placeholder (in my profile below I've already done this so you see my photo instead).
